Basic Requirements:

- BS or BA in occupational safety & health or related experience. Professional certification (e.g., CSP, CIH) is desired
- Minimum 10 years' experience in industrial health and safety. Experience in refining, chemical processing, or heavy manufacturing industry is desired
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively with all levels within in organization and to lead culture change
- Working knowledge of general health and safety regulations. Experience complying with Washington DOSH regulations is desired
- Good oral and written communication skills

Basic Function:

Drive the health, safety and security culture at US Oil toward the goal of zero incidents. Lead the development, implementation and coordination of refinery health, safety, and security programs including Respiratory Protection, Hearing Conservation, Accident Investigation, Fall Protection, Emergency Response, Confined Space Permits, Hot Work Permits, Gas Testing, Exposure Monitoring, and Material Safety Data Sheets.

Major Duties and Responsibilities:

- Exemplify safety leadership to all levels of the organization
- Fulfill role of Facility Safety Officer and Facility Security Officer
- Develop, implement, and maintain new and existing health, safety, and security programs and procedures to meet compliance requirements and corporate objectives
- Develop, implement, and/or coordinate EHS training
- Perform and/or coordinate accident investigations.
- Perform and/or coordinate health and safety audits.
- Monitor compliance with all federal, state and company health, safety, and security standards.
- Coordinate and ensure delivery of all regulatory and internal health, safety, and security reporting requirements.
- Maintain external networks with regulators (WADOSH), industrial associations (WSPA, AFPM). Contractors, and support organizations (TFD)

Other:

- This individual must be an effective communicator and plays a key role engaging on health, safety, and security matters with all levels of the organization.
